The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act relative to roadways and road markings.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 84 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020 Official Edition,

2 is hereby amended by inserting the following new section:-

3 Section 28.

4 Public utilities and private contractors shall be required to patch and seal roadways within 5 30 days after breaking ground, weather permitting, and shall be required to redraw any road 6 markings disturbed including but not limited to crosswalks, bike lanes, and passing lanes, within 7 30 days of said lines being disturbed, weather permitting. If these requirements are not met, the 8 local town or city public works commissioner shall order notice thereof to be given to the 9 delinquent utility or private entity, who shall be assessed a penalty of \$100 for the first month of 10 noncompliance after the initial 30 days has elapsed, and a penalty of no less than \$100 for each 11 week thereafter until the work is completed.
