An Act relative to business transactions.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 407 of the Act of 2022 is hereby amended by inserting after  
2 subsection (c) the following new subsection:-

3 (d) subsection (b) shall not apply to purchases from persons with a business registered  
4 with the secretary of state that are regularly engaged in the business of manufacturing catalytic  
5 converters or vehicles, or that are regularly engaged in the business of generating detached used  
6 catalytic converters in the ordinary course of the seller's business. For these purchases the buyer  
7 will be required to capture and retain the date, time, quantity of convertors and documentation of  
8 being in the licensed business.
