### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act to support veteran owned businesses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 12 of chapter 156C of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after subsection (d) the following subsection:-
- 3 (e) If one or more of the authorized persons is a United States Veteran, as defined in
- 4 clause Forty-third of section 7 of chapter 4 and upon presentation of evidence deemed
- satisfactory by the secretary of state, the fee for filing of the certificate of organization required
- 6 by subsection (a) and the fee for the filing of the annual report required by subsection (c) shall be
- 7 waived.
- 8 SECTION 2. The provisions of this act shall be effective commencing on January 1,
- 9 2025.
