The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act promoting equity in veterans' bonus eligibility.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Paragraph (1), subsection (b) of section 78 of chapter 10 of the General
2	Laws, as most recently amended by chapter 124 of the acts of 2020, is hereby amended by
3	inserting after the word "however" the following words:- any veteran discharged or released
4	under other than honorable conditions due to sexual orientation, gender identity, gender
5	expression, or HIV status, based on such veteran's DD-214 form or equivalent documentation,
6	shall be eligible for a bonus under this section; provided further,
7	SECTION 2. Subsection (g) of said section 78 is hereby further amended by striking the
8	word "service" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- service, unless any veteran is
9	discharged or released under other than honorable conditions yet deemed eligible pursuant to
10	paragraph (1), subsection (b) of this section.
