**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)**

An Act promoting dairy farms.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 31. Subsection (c) of section 11F of chapter 25A of the General Laws, as
2 appearing in the 2022 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting at the end of the
3 penultimate sentence the following:-

4 ; or (10) anaerobic digestion biomass to energy facilities and landfill gas to energy
5 facilities that are located in the commonwealth and are both operational and qualified as Class 1
6 renewable energy sources prior to November 7, 2021, which shall be eligible to participate in an
7 incentive program via a 1-time procurement for Class 1 renewable energy certificates which are
8 generated by existing anaerobic digestion facilities. The department shall determine eligibility
9 criteria for existing anaerobic digestion facilities to participate in such 1-time procurement, with
10 the total megawatt-hours being procured equal to the combined capacity of all facilities for up to
11 a 10-year term beginning January 1, 2024. Such megawatt-hour quantities shall be bid on a
12 contingent basis. Said 1-time procurement shall include a floor price sufficient to stimulate the
13 development of anaerobic digestion facilities.

SECTION 32. Section 40 of chapter 179 of the acts of 2022 is hereby repealed.
