The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act relative to the provision of health insurance for eligible employees and retirees in the town of Worthington.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the actions of

2 the town of Worthington and its Selectboard in offering health insurance coverage to town

3 employees, in accordance with G.L. c. 32B, are hereby validated, ratified, and confirmed, as if

4 the Town had properly voted to approve the question set forth in section 7A of said chapter 32B,

5 in accordance with law. The town may continue to provide such insurance and benefits under

6 said chapter 32B as if the voters of the town had properly approved the question set forth in said

7 section 7A of said chapter 32B; provided, however, that such actions are otherwise taken in

8 accordance with said chapter 32B.

9 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
