An Act to update expungement.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 276 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2022 Official Edition,
2	is hereby amended by striking out section 100Q and inserting in place thereof the following
3	section:-
4	100Q. Unless otherwise provided by law, no person shall make records sealed pursuant to
5	section 100A, section 100B or section 100C available for inspection in any form by any person.
6	No person shall make records expunged pursuant to section 100F, section 100G, section 100H or
7	section 100K available for inspection in any form by any person.
8	SECTION 2. Section 100T of Chapter 276 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is
9	hereby amended by striking out, in lines 1 to 2, the words "100A or section 100B" and inserting
10	in place thereof the following words:- 100A, section 100B or section 100C.
