By Representatives Doherty of Taunton and Haddad of Somerset, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 464) of Carol A. Doherty, Patricia A. Haddad and others for legislation to require schools to provide training on hands-only CPR and the use of defibrillators. Education.

**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)**

An Act providing hands-only CPR training and the use of defibrillators.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
2 section 2C, the following section:-

3 Section 2D. Each school district in the commonwealth shall provide instruction in hands-
4 only cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of an automated external defibrillator as part of
5 the existing physical education or health education curriculum in grades 9 through 12. The
6 school district may select a no-cost, non-certification instructional program to meet this
7 requirement. The instructional program provided shall be modeled from an instructional
8 program established by a nationally recognized association with expertise in instruction in
9 cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of an automated external defibrillator and include a
10 hands-on learning component for each participating student. Each public high school student
11 shall be required to participate in the instructional program as a requirement for high school
12 graduation; provided, however, that no student shall be required to take part in the instructional

13 program if (i) a licensed physician certifies in writing that such participation would be injurious
14 to the student; or (ii) a parent or guardian for the student submits a written objection to the
15 student's participation in the instructional program.

16 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on September 1, 2025.
