# The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act to provide for the future information technology needs of Massachusetts.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to provide forthwith for the information technology and security needs of the commonwealth and deploy broadband access to the citizens of the commonwealth, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. To provide for a program of capital investments for information technology
- 2 and data and cybersecurity improvements to various state programs, services, agencies,
- 3 institutions and properties and to fund technology infrastructure, the sums set forth in sections
- 4 2A, 2B, 2C and 2D of this act, for the several purposes and subject to the conditions specified in
- 5 this act, are hereby made available through December 31, 2030, subject to the laws regulating the
- 6 disbursement of public funds, which sums shall be in addition to any other amounts previously
- 7 appropriated for these purposes; provided, that the amounts specified for a particular project may
- 8 be adjusted in order to facilitate projects authorized in this act.

265	SECTION 3. Chapter 29 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
266	section 2DDDDDD the following section:-
267	Section 2EEEEEE. (a) There shall be established and set up on the books of the
268	commonwealth a separate, non-budgeted special revenue fund known as the Information
269	Technology Federal Reimbursement Fund, which shall be administered by the secretary of
270	technology services and security. The secretary shall expend money in the fund for information
271	technology projects related to the commonwealth's health and human services. There shall be
272	credited to the fund: (i) amounts equal to any federal financial participation revenues claimed
273	and received by the commonwealth for eligible expenditures made from this fund or from
274	eligible expenditures made in direct connection with eligible expenditures made from this fund;
275	and (ii) interest earned on any money in the fund. Amounts credited to the fund shall be

Money remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert to the General Fund and shall be available for expenditure in subsequent fiscal years.

SECTION 4. To meet the expenditures necessary to carry out sections 2A and 2B, the state treasurer shall, upon request of the governor, issue and sell bonds of the commonwealth in an amount to be specified by the governor from time to time, but not exceeding, in the aggregate, \$1,055,000,000. All bonds issued by the commonwealth under this section shall be designated on their face, "FutureTech Act of 2024", and shall be issued for a maximum term of years, not exceeding 10 years, as the governor may recommend to the general court under section 3 of Article LXII of the Amendments to the Constitution. All such bonds shall be payable not later than June 30, 2039.

SECTION 5. To meet the expenditures necessary to carry out section 2C, the state treasurer shall, upon request of the governor, issue and sell bonds of the commonwealth in an amount to be specified by the governor from time to time, but not exceeding, in the aggregate, \$175,000,000. All bonds issued by the commonwealth under this section shall be designated on their face, "FutureTech Act of 2024", and shall be issued for a maximum term of years, not exceeding 30 years, as the governor may recommend to the general court under section 3 of

Article LXII of the Amendments to the Constitution. All such bonds shall be payable not later than June 30, 2059.

SECTION 6. To meet the expenditures necessary to carry out section 2D, the state treasurer shall, upon request of the governor, issue and sell bonds of the commonwealth in an amount to be specified by the governor from time to time, but not exceeding, in the aggregate, \$26,989,000. All bonds issued by the commonwealth under this section shall be designated on their face, "FutureTech Act of 2024", and shall be issued for a maximum term of years, not exceeding 10 years, as the governor may recommend to the general court under section 3 of Article LXII of the Amendments to the Constitution. All such bonds shall be payable not later than June 30, 2039.
