The committee on Health Care Financing, to whom were referred the Bill to ensure access to medical parole (House, No. 2319); the Bill relative to health insurance and incarcerated individuals (House, No. 2327); the Bill relative to health education in women's correctional institutions (House, No. 2349); the Bill to ensure compliance with the anti-shackling law for pregnant incarcerated women (House, No. 2350); the Bill to provide reproductive health care to incarcerated individuals (House, No. 2371); the Bill to remove medical and health service fees for incarcerated people (House, No. 2372); the Bill relative to the postpartum treatment of women in correctional facilities (House, No. 2404); the Bill relative to overdose mapping (House, No. 4654); and the Bill relative to non-opioid alternatives in pain treatment (House, No. 4656), reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5016) ought to be adopted.

1 *Ordered,* That the committee on Health Care Financing be authorized to sit during a
2 recess of the General Court to make an investigation and study of House documents numbered
3 2319, 2327, 2349, 2350, 2371, 2372, 2404, 4654 and 4656, relative to medical parole, health care
4 for incarcerated persons, and opioid issues.

5 Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and study
6 and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
7 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives
8 on or before December 31, 2024.
