The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act establishing a prescription drug rebate program for seniors.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any laws to the contrary, all residents of the
2	Commonwealth over the age of 65 with an adjusted gross household income of \$50,000 annually
3	or less, are eligible for a prescription drug rebate.
4	SECTION 2. All prescription drugs, as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 94C of the
5	General Laws, are eligible for the rebate program.
6	SECTION 3. Rebate shall be defined as a reimbursement for the total out of pocket
7	expenses, including insurance co-pays, incurred by an eligible individual for prescription drugs.
8	Rebates shall be disbursed to eligible individuals from the General Fund.
9	SECTION 4 .The Commissioner shall prescribe the process by which an eligible
10	individual shall file for a rebate.
11	SECTION 5. Rebates shall not exceed \$2,500 per individual annually

- SECTION 6. The Commissioner shall report on the impact of this rebate program to the
 Committees of Ways & Means and the Joint Committee on Health Care Financing on an annual
 basis, commencing one year from the date the program goes into effect.
- 15 SECTION 7. This rebate program shall expire four years from the date of effect unless
- 16 reauthorized by the legislature.
