**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court  
(2023-2024)**

An Act relative to promoting innovation in elder care services.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any special or general law to the contrary, the executive  
2 office of health and human services shall, subject to appropriation, establish a no-interest,  
3 forgivable loan program for the purposes of (i) funding the development of nursing facility  
4 specialized care units, (ii) enabling facilities to offset the costs of pay-go capital improvements  
5 and (iii) funding innovative projects designed to reduce nursing facility bed capacity in order to  
6 meet the needs and preferences of older adults.

7           Funding to support nursing facility specialized care units shall include, but not be limited  
8 to: (a) infectious disease isolation; (b) dementia special care; (c) degenerative neurological units;  
9 (d) geriatric psychiatry; (e) traumatic brain injury; (f) in-house dialysis treatment; and (g)  
10 behavioral health and substance use disorder. Funding to offset the pay-go capital improvements  
11 shall include, but not be limited to: (a) heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems and air  
12 filtration system upgrades to mitigate the spread of airborne illnesses; (b) roof and other

13 infrastructure replacement and repair projects; (c) alternative energy conversion projects; and (d)  
14 elevator renovations to comply with new government requirements. Funding to promote  
15 innovative projects shall include, but not be limited to: (a) conversion of sections within nursing  
16 facilities into affordable housing, veterans housing, or assisted living units to better  
17 accommodate individual needs of residents; (b) converting multi-bed rooms to single occupancy  
18 to enhance privacy and dignity; and (c) establishing voluntary nursing facility reconfigurations,  
19 including financial incentives to reduce capacity and balance supply and demand based on  
20 regional needs.
