In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act providing for safe subdivision ways.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1.
- 2 Section 81Q of chapter 41 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018 Official Edition,
- 3 is hereby amended by inserting after the word "way" in line 39 the following:-
- 4 provided, however, that any rule or regulation so adopted shall allow dead end ways
- 5 providing a minimum pavement width of 20 feet and with a turnaround, but shall not limit the
- 6 length of such dead end to less than 1,200 feet or as specified by the State Fire Code as set forth
- 7 in the National Fire Prevention Association (NFPA) Code 1 and Publication 1141, as amended
- 8 (527 CMR 1.00), whichever length is shorter.
- 9 SECTION 2.

- Any existing rule or regulation promulgated under the subdivision control law shall
- 11 comply with this act by January 31, 2023 and until such time be waived by the planning board.
