Overview

The MBTA offered free ferry service from Lewis Mall Wharf to Long Wharf from April 25, 2022 to May 18, 2022, as an alternative to shuttle buses when Blue Line service was suspended for tunnel maintenance. Approximately 1,750 daily riders chose the ferry during the diversion, prompting the state legislature to fund a FY23, \$1M ferry service pilot between East Boston and downtown Boston.

Funding

"The fiscal year 2023 budget provided \$1 million for the pilot ferry service, funds the MBTA needs to spend by the end of the fiscal year on June 30, 2023. Lawmakers cited the East Boston ferry as a key mitigation measure during weekend Sumner Tunnel closures, and the full, five-month shutdown that will start next May. The T plans to pursue an extension to beyond FY23, which would enable that money to be spent on operating the ferry through next September. As part of the funding, the MBTA is required to send the Legislature a report on how many people ride the ferry by the end of January."

Service dates

Fall service operated from September 12 to November 30, 2022. The ferry was paused for the winter and will resume in the spring of 2023.

Schedule

The regular schedule included 296 departures per week: 44 per weekday and 38 per weekend day. https://cdn.mbta.com/sites/default/files/media/route_pdfs/09-12-2022-east-boston-ferry-fall-schedule.pdf

Additionally, from October 17-20, twelve trips per day (48 in total) were added between 8 PM and 10:45 PM to provide an evening travel option during Blue Line track work.

Fares

A one-way fare is \$2.40; which is the same price as the subway. Fares can be purchased at the Long Wharf ticket booth and on the mTicket app. LinkPasses, Commuter Rail zone passes and M-7 passes also accepted.



Seasonal influence on ridership

Ferry ridership historically increases in the warmer months of spring and summer, and decreases in the cooler, fall and winter

Reflective of this pattern, East Boston ferry ridership was highest in September, followed by declining ridership in October and November. This seasonal decline was also noted on the Hingham, Hull, and Charlestown ferry routes.
