An Act to allow the Wrentham Board of Selectmen to increase the number of alcohol licenses for on-premises consumption for the town of Wrentham by 7.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1: Notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, the local  
2           licensing authority of the town of Wrentham may grant an additional seven (7) licenses for the  
3           sale of all alcoholic beverages to be consumed on the premises.

4           SECTION 2. That the General Court may make clerical or editorial changes of form only  
5           to the bill, unless the Board of Selectmen approve amendments to the bill before enactment by  
6           the General Court, and provided further that the Board of Selectmen is hereby authorized to  
7           approve amendments which shall be within the scope of the general public objectives of this  
8           petition.

9           SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
