An Act to lift kids out of deep poverty.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 118 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the fourth paragraph and inserting in place  
3 thereof the following paragraph:--

4           Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the payment standards for  
5 monthly benefits for the program not including the rental allowance shall be increased effective  
6 July first of each year beginning with July 1, 2023 by 25 percent above the payment standard in  
7 effect in the previous fiscal year until the payment standard for the household size equals 50  
8 percent of the federal poverty level for the household size; provided further, that once the  
9 payment standard for the household size equals 50 percent of the federal poverty level for the  
10 household size, the payment standard shall be increased effective July first of each year in order

11 that the payment standard shall be no less than 50 percent of the poverty level for the household  
12 size as determined by the federal Department of Health and Human Services; provided further,  
13 that the need standard and the payment amounts shall be further increased by the amount of a  
14 clothing allowance in the month for which it is paid and by the rental allowance for households  
15 incurring a rent or mortgage expense and not residing in public or subsidized housing.

16 SECTION 2. Section 1 of chapter 117A of the General Laws is hereby amended by  
17 inserting after the first paragraph the following new paragraph:-

18 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the payment standards for  
19 monthly benefits for the program shall be increased effective July first of each year beginning  
20 with July 1, 2023 by 25 percent above the payment standard in effect in the previous fiscal year  
21 until the payment standard for the household size equals 50 percent of the federal poverty level  
22 for the household size; provided further, that once the payment standard for the household size  
23 equals 50 percent of the federal poverty level for the household size, the payment standard shall  
24 be increased effective July first of each year in order that the payment standard shall be no less  
25 than 50 percent of the poverty level for the household size as determined by the federal  
26 Department of Health and Human Services.
