**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)**

An Act reforming the Massachusetts civil rights act.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 11I of chapter 12 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 inserting after the word “damages.” the following:-

3 In an action brought under this section against a person or entity acting under color of
4 law, proof shall not be required that the interference or attempted interference was by threats,
5 intimidation or coercion.

6 SECTION 2. Section 11I of chapter 12 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding
7 the following new paragraph:-

8 In an action for monetary damages brought under this section against a law enforcement
9 officer, as defined in section 1 of chapter 6E, acting under color of law, qualified immunity shall
10 not apply where the defendant cannot establish that the conduct was clearly lawful. Nothing in
11 this section shall affect the provisions of chapter 258 with respect to indemnification of public
12 employees.

SECTION 3. The provisions of this act will take effect immediately upon enactment.
