By Mr. O'Connor, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1266) of Patrick M. O'Connor and Jason M. Lewis for legislation relative to PANDAS/PANS. Mental Health, Substance Use and Recovery.

**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)**

An Act relative to PANDAS/PANS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 (a) Notwithstanding any special or general law to the contrary, the Department of Mental
2 Health, in conjunction with the Department of Education shall conduct a study of pediatric and
3 adolescent psychiatric hospital settings and therapeutic day schools to determine if any children
4 within these settings have root causes in missed or known neuroimmune issues or pediatric
5 autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections and pediatric
6 acute-onset neuropsychiatric syndrome.

7 (b) In conducting the study, the Department of Mental Health and Department of
8 Education shall use established clinical criteria developed by the PANS/PANDAS Consortium
9 available through the PANDAS Physicians Network, and other experts specializing in the
10 treatment and diagnosis of pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with
11 streptococcal infections and pediatric acute-onset neuropsychiatric syndrome. The Departments
12 shall interview children and families who had previously been misdiagnosed and subsequently

13 found to have pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal
14 infections and pediatric acute-onset neuropsychiatric syndrome while they were accessing
15 support through the Department of Mental Health. Further, the departments shall consult with the
16 Department of Public Health's PANDAS/PANS Advisory Council and professionals in pediatric
17 and adolescent psychiatric hospital settings and therapeutic day schools.

18 (c) The findings of the study shall include, but no limited to, the following:

19 (i) Identify the prevalence of pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated
20 with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute-onset neuropsychiatric syndrome in pediatric
21 and adolescent psychiatric hospital settings and therapeutic day schools.

22 (ii) Report outcomes of interviewed children & families who had been previously
23 misdiagnosed and subsequently found to have pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders
24 associated with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute-onset neuropsychiatric syndrome.

25 (d) By December 31, 2023, the Department of Mental Health and the Department of
26 Education shall report the findings of the study to the Joint Committee on Public Health, the
27 Joint Committee on Mental Health and Substance Use and Recovery, the Department of Public
28 Health, the PANDAS/PANS Advisory Council and the Clerk of the Senate and Clerk of the
29 House of Representatives.
