Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 59 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020 Official Edition, is hereby
- 2 amended by inserting after section 5N the following new section:-
- 3 Section 50. In any city or town that accepts this section, the board of selectmen of a
- 4 town, or in a municipality having a town council form of government, the town council or the
- 5 mayor, with the approval of the city council in a city, may establish a bifurcated or progressive
- 6 tax rate on real property.
