An Act to ensure timely restitution payments to victims of crime.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. When a defendant is released from custody or probation and a restitution  
2 order has not been paid in full to a victim or family member as defined in section 1 of chapter  
3 258B, the department of revenue shall collect the unpaid amount by withholding the wages of  
4 the offender.

5           The department of revenue shall establish a division of restitution enforcement which  
6 shall be provided, subject to appropriation, with such resources as may be necessary to  
7 implement the provisions of this section. The commissioner may promulgate regulations for the  
8 effective administration of the restitution enforcement program.
