**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)**

An Act relating to public access to historical records.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 7 of Chapter 66 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the following
- 2 sentence:- All records in the custody of the state secretary shall be open to public inspection and
- 3 available for copying after the expiration of 75 years from the creation of the record.
