The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act establishing an Indigenous Peoples Day.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 6 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section 12V and
- 2 inserting in place thereof the following section:—
- 3 Section 12V. The governor shall annually issue a proclamation setting apart the second
- 4 Monday in October as Indigenous Peoples Day and recommending that it be observed by the
- 5 people, with appropriate exercises in the schools and otherwise, to acknowledge the history of
- 6 genocide and discrimination against Indigenous peoples, and to recognize and celebrate the
- 7 thriving cultures and continued resistance and resilience of Indigenous peoples and their tribal
- 8 nations.
