**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)**

An Act to establish a COVID-19 Remembrance Day.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 6 of the general laws, as appearing in the 2020 Official Edition, is
2 hereby amended by inserting, after section MMMMMM, the following new section:-

3 Section NNNNNN. The governor shall annually issue a proclamation setting apart
4 March 10 as COVID-19 Remembrance Day to honor all who died or were stricken and their
5 families from COVID-19 and subsequent variants especially older adults and people with
6 disabilities, to appreciate those first responders, caregivers, and researchers who cared for
7 victims or developed treatments or vaccines in response to the virus, and to evaluate public
8 health preparedness and response to long-term conditions from the virus, and shall recommend
9 that the day be observed in an appropriate manner by the people.
