**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)**

An Act designating September as PCOS awareness month.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 6 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 15LLLLLL
2 the following section:-

3 Section 15MMMMMM. The governor shall annually issue a proclamation setting apart
4 the month of September as Polycystic Ovary Syndrome Awareness Month to increase citizens'
5 awareness of the most common endocrine (hormone) disorder in women, in order to lead to
6 better education and thus earlier diagnoses, intervention and care. The proclamation shall
7 recommend that the month of September be observed in an appropriate manner by the people.
