An Act establishing the annual observance of September 11th Remembrance Day.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 6 of the general laws are hereby amended by adding the following section:-  
2 15CCCCC. The governor shall annually issue a proclamation setting apart the eleventh  
3 day of September as the September 11th Day of Remembrance in recognition of the loss of life  
4 and service of first responders at the World Trade Center in New York City, New York on  
5 September 11, 2001, and recommending that said day be observed in an appropriate manner by  
6 the people.
