In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act supporting municipal light plants.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 6 of Chapter 25A of the General Laws, as amended by chapter 8 of the acts of
- 2 2021, is hereby amended by striking out, in clause (14), the words "chapter 21N" and inserting in
- 3 place thereof the following:-
- 4 "chapter 21N; and
- 5 (15) assist municipal lighting plants in their efforts to reduce greenhouse gas emissions
- 6 by facilitating collaboration between municipal lighting plants and other state, local, regional,
- 7 and federal agencies, and by providing municipal lighting plants with: (i) training; (ii) analysis
- 8 tools to determine which greenhouse gas emission reduction and electrification programs and
- 9 strategies to prioritize; (iii) information on state programs in which they are eligible to
- participate; and (iv) sample designs and materials for greenhouse gas emission reduction and

- electrification programs; provided, that any training, analysis, information, or assistance
- provided to municipal lighting plants under this section shall promote compliance with the
- commonwealth's statewide greenhouse gas emission limits and sublimits established pursuant to
- chapter 21N".
