**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)**

An Act to promote public payroll transparency.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 6A of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 16CC the
2 following section:-

3 Section 16DD. (a) For purposes of this section, the term 'quasi-government agency' shall
4 mean a corporation that: (i) is supported by the government to provide services to citizens,
5 including, but not limited to, operating public buses and rail systems, developing drinking water
6 and managing public pension information; and (ii) has certain budgetary, governing and policy-
7 making independence from the executive and legislative branches.

8 (b) Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, a quasi-government
9 agency shall submit compensation information to the comptroller and the comptroller shall post
10 such information on the commonwealth's open checkbook website.

11 (c) Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the state auditor shall
12 publicly post audits conducted of a quasi-government agency on its website.
