**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)**

An Act relative to the availability of sunscreen for students.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 71 of the Massachusetts General Laws, as appearing in the 2020
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding after section 97 the following section:-

3 Section 98. Any person, including but not limited to students, parents or school
4 personnel may possess and use a topical sunscreen product without a physician’s note or
5 prescription while on school property or at a school-related event or activity to avoid
6 overexposure to the sun if the product is regulated by the Federal Food and Drug Administration
7 for over-the-counter use.

8 For the purposes of this Section only, sunscreen is not an over-the-counter medication.

9 Nothing in this section requires school personnel to assist pupils in applying sunscreen.

10 The school district may encourage school sites to educate pupils on sun safety
11 precautions.
