An Act to expand dual enrollment for high school students in Gateway Cities.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 15A of the General Laws, as so appearing in the 2020 edition, is  
2 hereby amended by inserting after section 9B the following new section:-

3 Section 9C. The department shall administer an Early College Access Program, subject to  
4 appropriation, providing needs-based financial assistance for high school students eligible for the  
5 Commonwealth Dual Enrollment Partnership (CDEP). Such assistance shall be granted to  
6 students living in or attending high school in a gateway municipality, as defined in section 3A of  
7 chapter 23A, and who also qualify for or receive free or reduced-price lunch under the federally-  
8 funded school meals program. Students receiving financial assistance under the Early College  
9 Access Program will participate in CDEP at no cost and may earn up to 24 college credits.
