An Act relative to prescription opioid abuse prevention education.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Section 1 of chapter 71 of the general laws, as so appearing in the 2020 edition, is hereby  
2 amended by inserting after the word “violence”, in line 22, the following words:- “, prescription  
3 opioid abuse prevention, with an emphasis on the prescription drug epidemic and the connection  
4 between prescription opioid abuse and addiction to other drugs, such as heroin,”.
