An Act to increase special education circuit breaker reimbursement from 75% to 90%.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 5A of chapter 71B of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in subsection (c), the number “75”, and inserting in
- 3 place thereof the number “90”.
