**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)**

An Act strengthening the Attorney General’s tools to protect nursing home residents and other patients from abuse and neglect.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 72K of chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020 Official
2 Edition, is hereby amended by striking out subsection (b) and inserting in place thereof the
3 following 2 new subsections:-

4 (b) The attorney general may file a civil action against a person who commits abuse,
5 mistreatment or neglect of a patient or resident or who misappropriates patient or resident
6 property, or against a person who wantonly or recklessly permits or causes another to commit
7 abuse, mistreatment or neglect of a patient or resident or who misappropriates patient or resident
8 property. The civil penalty for such abuse, mistreatment, neglect or misappropriation shall not
9 exceed: \$25,000 if no bodily injury results; \$50,000 if bodily injury results; \$100,000 if sexual

10 assault or serious bodily injury results; and \$250,000 if death results. Section 60B of chapter 231
11 shall not apply to an action brought by the attorney general pursuant to this section. Nothing in
12 this section shall preclude the filing of any action brought by the attorney general or a private
13 party pursuant to chapter 93A or any action by the department pursuant to this chapter.

14 (c) Notwithstanding section 5 of chapter 260, the attorney general may file a civil action
15 only within four years next after an offense is committed.
