By Mr. Fattman, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 50) of Ryan C. Fattman, Lindsay N. Sabadosa and Patrick M. O'Connor for legislation to further defining eligibility for medical use marijuana. Cannabis Policy.

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act further defining eligibility for medical use marijuana.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 94I of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out lines 20 through 25 and inserting in place
- 3 thereof the following:-
- 4 "Debilitating medical condition", cancer, glaucoma, positive status for human
- 5 immunodeficiency virus, acquired immune deficiency syndrome, hepatitis C, amyotrophic lateral
- 6 sclerosis, Crohn's disease, Parkinson's disease, multiple sclerosis, post-traumatic stress disorder,
- 7 opioid use disorder, and other conditions as determined in writing by a registered qualifying
- 8 patient's registered healthcare professional.
- 9 SECTION 2. Said section 1 of said chapter 94I of the General Laws, as so appearing, is
- 10 hereby further amended by striking out lines 84 through 86 and inserting in place thereof the
- 11 following:-

"Qualifying patient", (1) a person who has been diagnosed by a registered healthcare professional as having a debilitating medical condition, or (2) a veteran receiving their health care at a federal Veterans Administration facility provides their Veterans Administration "Blue Button Report Problem List" indicating an existing debilitating medical condition to the commission.
