The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act to promote natural carbon sequestration.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 21N of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting, after section 3B, the 2 following section:-
- 3 Section 3C. The Secretary shall, in consultation with the department and the coastal zone
- 4 management office created in Section 4A of Chapter 21A, develop a quantified net positive
- 5 statewide carbon sequestration and storage goal for natural and working lands as defined in
- 6 Section 1. In consideration of Massachusetts' substantial coastline, the Secretary shall study the
- 7 sequestration capacity of its salt marshes, seagrasses, and waterways in developing the
- 8 Commonwealth's carbon sequestration goal. The sequestration goal shall be determined in
- 9 agreement with the statewide greenhouse gas emission reductions goals as established by the
- 10 Secretary.
