An Act relative to the compulsory automobile insurance limits.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 34A of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as so appearing in the 2020  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out in line 102 the word “twenty” and inserting  
3 in place thereof the word “fifty” and by striking out in line 104 the word “forty” and inserting in  
4 place thereof the word “one hundred”.

5           SECTION 2. Section 34O of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as so appearing in the 2020  
6 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out in line 17 the word “five” and inserting in  
7 place thereof the word “thirty”.
