An Act relative to Rosa Parks Day.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 6 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020 Official Edition, is
2 hereby amended by inserting after Section 15BBBBBB, the following section:-

3 The Governor shall annually issue a proclamation setting aside February fourth as Rosa
4 Parks Day, in lasting recognition of a historic civil rights leader, and recommend that the day be
5 observed in an appropriate manner by the people.

6 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
