An Act relative to soldiers' home eligibility for certain national guard members.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Section 1 of Chapter 115A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2022 Official  
2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the words “section two,” the following words:-  
3           “or (c) any person who meets the requirements of the Massachusetts National Guard state  
4 retired list, as defined in section 31 of chapter 33, notwithstanding any general law or special law  
5 to the contrary”
