**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court
(2025-2026)**

An Act relative to eliminating the PCP referral requirement for specialty gynecological care.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Subsection (g) of section 15 of chapter 176O of the General Laws, as appearing in the
2 2022 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting in place
3 thereof the following sentence:- No carrier shall require an insured to obtain a referral or prior
4 authorization from a primary care provider for specialty care provided by an obstetrician,
5 gynecologist, certified nurse-midwife or family practitioner participating in such carrier's health
6 care provider network for the following: (i) annual preventive gynecologic health examinations,
7 including any subsequent obstetric or gynecological services determined by such obstetrician,
8 gynecologist, certified nurse-midwife or family practitioner to be medically necessary as a result
9 of such examination; (ii) preventative gynecologic health care and menstrual health conditions
10 such as abnormal uterine bleeding, dysmenorrhea and pelvic pain; (iii) maternity care; and (iv)
11 medically necessary evaluations and resultant health care services for acute or emergency
12 gynecological conditions.
