**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court
(2025-2026)**

An Act relative to insurance surcharges.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 113B of chapter 175 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2022 Official
2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the word “incident” in line 227, the following
3 sentence:- Driving a motor vehicle which has an expired inspection sticker shall not be
4 considered a surchargeable incident.
