**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court
(2025-2026)**

An Act relative to due process.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 6E of the General Laws is amended by adding the following sentence after the
2 second sentence in sec.10(f):

3 “For all decisions of the Commission resulting in suspensions in excess of 2 weeks or
4 decertification, the CH.30A appeal shall include a de novo review.”
