An Act relative to appealing a notice of disinvitation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 120 of chapter 266 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2022 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following 2 paragraphs:-
- Whoever, having a good faith reasonable belief that they have a right to access the
- 4 premises and receives written notice informing them that they are no longer welcome on the
- 5 premises and entering the premises would reasonably result in criminal trespass pursuant to this
- 6 section, may file a complaint in the district court seeking to vacate such written notice.
- 7 An order to vacate such written notice shall be in the discretion of the court if the court
- 8 determines that the person who directly provided said written notice abused their discretion of
- 9 control of said premises. The court's order shall be a complete affirmative defense to any
- prosecution against the person receiving such notice under any provision of this section.
