**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court
(2025-2026)**

An Act relative to workers' compensation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 45 of chapter 152 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2022 Official Edition,
2 is hereby amended by inserting after the word 'forfeited' in line 13 the following sentence: -

3 "If, as a result of the examination, the registered physician determines that the employee
4 is fit to return to work and the employee refuses to return to work, his right to compensation shall
5 be suspended, and his compensation during the period of suspension may be forfeited."
