**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court
(2025-2026)**

An Act relative to special state police officers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 22C of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the following section:-

2 Section 74. (a) The colonel may appoint as special state police officers retired uniformed
3 members who, as the colonel deems necessary, may perform police details or any police duties
4 arising therefrom during the course of police detail work, whether or not related to the detail
5 work.

6 (b) Retired uniformed members appointed as special state police officers under this
7 section shall:

8 (i) have retired prior to the date of the appointment as a special state police officer;

9 (ii) have a state police discharge status of honorable;

10 (iii) be deemed by the colonel necessary, suitable, qualified and fit to perform the same
11 essential functions and duties as uniformed members of the department;

12 (iv) be certified by the police officer standards and training commission pursuant to
13 section 4 of chapter 6E;

14 (v) be subject to or exempt from department rules as determined by the colonel; and

15 (vi) be equipped, trained and deployed as determined by the colonel.

16 (c) Appointed retired uniformed members shall, in accordance with sections 91 and 91A
17 of chapter 32, be at-will employees subject to appointment and removal by the colonel in a
18 manner consistent with sections 52 and 53 and shall be appointed for a term of 1 year subject to
19 renewal in the colonel's sole discretion. Appointed retired uniformed members shall not be
20 subject to the civil service law or rules, shall not be entitled to any benefits of such law or rules,
21 but shall, in the performance of assigned duties and for the purposes of section 9A of chapter
22 258, be deemed a member of the department.
