By Representative Cabral of New Bedford, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2575) of Antonio F. D. Cabral and Christine P. Barber relative to law enforcement agreements to enforce federal law. Public Safety and Homeland Security.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court

An Act relative to administering state and local agreements.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 37 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2022 Official Edition,
2 is hereby amended by adding the following section:

3 Section 27. Agreements to Enforce Federal Law

4 (a) Sheriffs and their employees may only perform functions pursuant to an agreement
5 described in 8 U.S.C. § 1357(g) if the costs of such performance, including employee
6 compensation, are borne solely by the Federal government and there is a state statute explicitly
7 authorizing such agreements.

8 (b) The Sheriff shall keep books, records and accounts of all activities under this section,
9 which shall be open to inspection and shall be annually reported to the house and senate
10 committees on ways and means, the joint committee on the judiciary and the joint committee on
11 public safety and homeland security. Said book shall be a public record, as defined in clause 27
12 of section 7 of chapter 4 of the General Laws.

SECTION 2. Chapter 124 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby amended by adding the following section:

Section 11. Agreements to Enforce Federal Law.

(a) Any employee of the department of corrections, jail, houses of corrections, or other correctional institutions of the Commonwealth may only perform functions pursuant to an agreement described in 8 U.S.C. § 1357(g) if the costs of such performance, including employee compensation, are borne solely by the Federal government and there is a state statute explicitly authorizing such agreements.

(b) The commissioner of correction shall keep books, records and accounts of all activities under this section, which shall be open to inspection and shall be annually reported to the house and senate committees on ways and means, the joint committee on the judiciary and the joint committee on public safety and homeland security. Said book shall be a public record, as defined in clause 27 of section 7 of chapter 4 of the General Laws.

SECTION 3. Chapter 12 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2022 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after Section 5O the following new sections:-

Section 5P.

(a) As used in this section, the following words shall have the following meanings:

“Agreement”, any contract, agreement, memorandum of understanding, or other arrangement pursuant to Section 1357(g) of Title 8 of the United States Code.

32 "Law enforcement agency", an agency in the Commonwealth charged with enforcement
33 of state and municipal laws, including but not limited to municipal police departments, campus
34 police departments, and Massachusetts State Police.

35 (b) The Commonwealth and any law enforcement agencies, municipalities, or other
36 subdivisions and their employees may only perform functions pursuant to an agreement
37 described in 8 U.S.C. § 1357(g) if the costs of such performance, including employee
38 compensation, are borne solely by the Federal government and there is a state statute explicitly
39 authorizing such agreements.

40 (c) The Attorney General may promulgate rules and regulations for purposes of
41 implementing this section, including but not limited to keeping books, records and accounts of
42 all activities under this section and said book shall be a public record, as defined in clause 27 of
43 section 7 of chapter 4 of the General Laws.
