An Act relative to violation of regulation regarding hot work processes.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 22 of the General Laws us hereby amended by adding the following section:-

2 Section 23. The department of fire services in cooperation with the division of  
3 occupational licensure and code enforcement officers authorized under chapter 148A, shall  
4 collect data on written notices of code violations and fines arising from violations of, or non-  
5 compliance with, chapter 148 or any rules or regulations issued under said chapter 148 including,  
6 but not limited to: (i) the failure of an individual to maintain hot work training certification; (ii)  
7 performing hot work without hot work training certification; and (iii) failure to comply with hot  
8 work permit requirements.

9           The department shall develop, operate and maintain a database containing the  
10 information required to be collected under this section. The database shall: (i) be publicly  
11 accessible on the department's website; and (ii) allow for an automated notification system to  
12 alert affected property owners and insurance companies.
