An Act relative to a license for the use of certain state land by the town of Southwick.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the department  
2   of capital asset management and maintenance and the town of Southwick may enter into a  
3   license for a renewable term of 5-years to use the North pond boat ramp on Point Grove road in  
4   the town of Southwick for parking purposes.

5           SECTION 2. The license in section 1 shall not be a disposition of an interest in land of  
6   the commonwealth and shall not be subject to Article 97 of the Amendments to the  
7   Massachusetts Constitution or section 5A of chapter 3 of the General Laws.
