An Act relative to government surplus supply.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           General Laws, Part I Title III Chapter 30B the Uniform Procurement Act Section 15(a) is  
2 hereby amended by adding after section (g):-

4           “(h) Notwithstanding any other requirement of this section, a governmental body may,  
5 unless otherwise prohibited by law, dispose of a tangible supply no longer useful to the  
6 governmental body but having resale or salvage value, using written procedures approved by the  
7 governmental body, provided the written procedures clearly identify the tangible supply and the  
8 interest served by the manner of disposal described therein.”
