**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court
(2025-2026)**

An Act relative to the sale of electric vehicles.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 179 of the acts of 2022, as amended by chapter 268 of the acts of
2 2022, is hereby further amended by striking out section 46.

3 SECTION 2. Subsection (a) of section 81 of said chapter 179 is hereby amended by
4 striking out the words: “(iii) cessation, by December 31, 2035, of in-state sales of non-zero-
5 emission vehicles; and (iv) advancement of access to, and affordability of, electric vehicle
6 charging and fueling,” and inserting in place thereof the following words:- and (iii) advancement
7 of access to, and affordability of, electric vehicle charging and fueling.

8 SECTION 3. Said chapter 179, as so amended, is hereby further amended by striking out
9 section 96.
