**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court
(2025-2026)**

An Act relative to electronic toll payments.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 13 of chapter 6C of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020 Official Edition,
2 is hereby amended by adding the following subsection:-

3 (d) Information on tolls, including, where applicable, toll usage, tolls due, balance, late
4 and other fees, fines, penalties and other amounts due associated with toll or other transactions
5 and payment options shall be made available through an online database that is searchable by
6 both (i) vehicle registration number and (ii) date of toll assessment. Such information shall be
7 accessible through the online database within 1 business day of a toll being assessed. Information
8 for accessing the online database shall be printed on a sign visible to drivers at the point where a
9 toll is assessed. No invoice issued by the department to a vehicle’s registered owner of record or

10 responsible party for purposes of collecting tolls shall be mailed fewer than 7 days after the
11 assessment of a toll.
