An Act relative to the adjudicative process of the Board of State Examiners of Electricians.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 13 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2022 Official Edition,  
2 is hereby amended by inserting after section 32A the following new section:-

3           Section 32B. Dispute hearings before the board of state examiners of electricians and the  
4 board of electricians' appeals shall be open to the public. The boards shall permit a member of  
5 the public for whom the electrician in the dispute has conducted electrical work to submit a  
6 written affidavit or testimonial about the electrician's work.
